


Supporting Your Friend

2026 Joint Admissions Exercise

- Application for JAE is via the JAE-Internet System (JAE-IS)
- Submit your course choices through the JAE website at www.moe.gov.sg/jae
- Application Period
Start: Wednesday, 14 January 2026, 4.00pm
End: Monday, 19 January 2026, 4.30pm



Digital Copy of Form A

- You will receive an email in the afternoon from **2.45pm on Wednesday, 14 January 2026** about your JAE eligibility.
- The email will contain Form A if you are eligible for JAE.
- Candidates eligible for JAE may also download Form A from the JAE-Internet System (JAE-IS) using your Singpass.



JAE Form A

Contains the following information:

- O-Level subjects and the grades used to calculate your aggregate scores
- CCA grade
- Your gross aggregate scores (without bonus points)
- The courses that you are eligible to apply in the JAE



Registration Process

- Before accessing the JAE website at www.moe.gov.sg/jae, you are encouraged to complete the JAE worksheet accessible at www.moe.gov.sg/jaeworksheet
- Will require Singpass
- Provide a local mobile phone number in the **mobile number field** to receive your posting results via SMS
- Make use of the 12 choices .
- Takes approximately 15 minutes



Registration Process

- It is advisable to indicate at least 2 to 3 courses where your aggregate scores are better than the previous year's course cut-off points (COP).
- Make your course choices wisely. Posting is based on merit according to your net aggregate scores (taking into account the various bonus points eligible).
- Appeals for transfer to another JC are not likely to be successful unless you meet the COP of the JC course for that year's JAE.



Successful Submission of Application

- Upon successful submission of your JAE application, the Verification Slip will be sent to the email address you provided.
- Take a screenshot of your Verification Slip and retain a copy of it as proof of course application.
- Send the screenshot of your JAE application Verification Slip to your CMs by **Friday, 16 January 2026, 12.00pm**.



If You Receive a Counteroffer

- If you are **not given the course** you applied for, you **may** receive a **counteroffer**.
- You **must accept the counteroffer first** before you can submit any **appeals** for your preferred course.
- If not, your place will be forfeited. It will then be made available to other eligible applicants appealing for a place in the course.

Posting Results

- The JAE posting results will be released at **9.00am, Tuesday, 3 February 2026** through:
 - JAE Internet System (JAE-IS), which can be accessed using your Singpass to view your posting results until **11.59pm on Monday, 9 February 2026**.
 - SMS, which is sent to the mobile number in your application.



JAE / JIE for O-Level Students

- If you did not receive a JAE posting, ITE might offer you a place in a Nitec course soon after the release of the JAE posting results.
- If you hear from ITE, do consider the offer carefully, as it will give you a chance to continue your studies.
- If you have accepted ITE's offer, you still have the option of appealing for a Higher Nitec course during JAE appeals.



JAE Appeals

- **Which courses should I appeal for?**
 - You can only appeal for courses where you meet the current year's cut-off point, as well as the Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs)
 - Refer to the JAE appeals website for information on the net aggregate range for specific courses for the current year
 - Refer to the JAE booklet for information on the subject-specific MERs on courses that you are interested to appeal
 - Apply for a range of courses offered by ITE as appeal postings are subject to available vacancies



JAE Appeals

- **How do I appeal for a course?**
 - Submit your appeal through the JAE appeal website at <https://jaeappeal.edu.sg>
 - Use all your 6 JAE appeals choices carefully
 - For additional advice, you can approach Mr Wong, Ms Grace, Mr Dileep or visit the ECG centre at MOE Grange Road.



After JAE Appeals

How do I check for the outcome of my JAE appeal?

- You will be informed of your appeal outcome through the JAE online appeal website, as well as through SMS.
- Look out for your appeal outcome, and consider the course you were posted to carefully.



Direct School Admissions-Junior College (DSA-JC) Exercise

- Students who had accepted offers through the 2025 DSA-JC Exercise will be admitted to their chosen JC if they have met the eligibility criteria for admission based on their GCE O-Level examination results.
- Students admitted to a JC through DSA-JC will not be eligible to participate in the JAE.
- Students who do not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in JAE to apply for courses they are eligible for.

Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) - Polytechnics

- Students who had accepted conditional offers to a polytechnic course through EAE and have their offers confirmed based on their GCE O-Level examination results will not be eligible to participate in JAE.
- Students who do not meet the criteria may take part in JAE.

Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) - ITE

- Students who had accepted conditional offers via ITE EAE in 2025 and have their offers confirmed based on their GCE O-Level examination results will not be eligible to participate in JAE.
- Their EAE offers are confirmed if they meet the subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements for the course.
