

Combined Uniformed Groups (UG) Overseas Trip to Kuching, Sarawak



26th to 31st December 2013

On the 26th to 31st of December 2013, 26 students and 3 teachers from the Girl Guides and National Police Cadet Corps embarked on a journey to Kuching, Sarawak for the Combined Uniformed Groups Overseas trip.

Throughout the span of six days, the group spent meaningful time learning about the cultural and heritage background of this state of Malaysia. On the second day of the trip, the group experienced a homestay in a traditional longhouse with an aboriginal group's village. They got to eat durians and jackfruits harvested from the orchard of the people. Also, some of the group were chosen to wear the traditional costume and all of them learnt the traditional Eagle dance of the Bidayuh people. The next day, the group visited the Sarawak Cultural Village where they learnt all about the different groups of people found in Sarawak. They also visited an Orang Utan reserve. On the fourth day, the group went caving at two caves renowned in Kuching for their natural beauty. The students were also enriched by the wealth of knowledge at the Sarawak museum.

On the last day of the trip, the students went to the Salvation Army Children Home where they had a meaningful exchange with the children, playing games, teaching them basic English and many more. The trip concluded with the students learning how to make Kueh Lapis at a Kueh Lapis factory.

It was indeed a memorable trip for the students as they learnt a lot from the interaction with the students from the involvement at the Children Home as well as the excursion to the different cultural and historical sites.
